NOSES KNOW!



It's rare for natural gas leaks to occur, but if you smell sulfur or rotten eggs, it could possibly be a leak. Because natural gas has no smell of its own, an odorant, called Mercaptan, is added to give it a distinctive smell. This allows you to quickly identify a gas leak and take swift action.

What should you do if you smell natural gas? Leave the premises or location **IMMEDIATELY**, and from a safe distance, call 911 or WG+E at the number above. Never assume someone else will make the call. Avoid actions that might cause a spark, such as striking a match or smoking, operating appliances or light switches, using a phone, or starting a vehicle. Stay away from the area of concern and keep others away, too, until an official says it is safe to return.

Whether you are a natural gas customer or not, learning how to recognize and respond to a leak can keep you and our community safe. Watch for a separate bill insert in October for more info on identifying a gas leak, or visit the Safety page of our website at wgeld. org. And always remember: a call to 811 at least three days before any digging project helps you avoid striking underground utilities, causing inconvenient outages, creating dangerous leaks, incurring injury or costly repairs.
